FIXED-PRICE SERVICE AGREEMENT

This Agreement entered into on this day of	of, 199_, by and between
Oklahoma State University, an institute of hig	her education of the State of Oklahoma,
hereinafter referred to as "University", and Ur	niversity of Chihuahua, hereinafter referred to as
"Sponsor."	

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Sponsor desires to retain University to perform Agricultural Doctoral Instruction; and

WHEREAS, University, in furtherance of its educational objectives, desires to undertake the performance of the said service under the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth;

TERMS

In consideration of the mutual promises and conditions herein contained, the parties agree as follows:

1.0 DEFINITIONS

As used herein, the following terms shall have the following meanings:

- 1.01 "Project" shall mean the Project as described in the Statement of Work, marked as "Exhibit A", which is incorporated into this Agreement.
- 1.02 "Agreement Period" is <u>March 1, 2004 through February 28, 2007</u> unless sooner terminated as provided herein.

2.0 SCOPE OF WORK

- 2.01 University shall commence the performance of the Project promptly after the effective date of this Agreement, and shall use reasonable efforts to perform the Project substantially in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement. Anything in this Agreement to the contrary notwithstanding, Sponsor and University may at any time amend Project by mutual written agreement.
- 2.02 The Project will be under the direction of <u>David Henneberry</u> as Project Director for the Project and others (e.g. technicians, graduate students, post-doctoral fellows or faculty members) as assigned by the Project Director.

2.03 In the event that the Project Director becomes unable or unwilling to continue the Project or leaves the employment of the University, a mutually acceptable substitute will be selected. In the event a mutually acceptable substitute is not available, University and/or Sponsor shall have the option to terminate the Project.

3.0 COSTS, BILLINGS, OTHER SUPPORT AND OBLIGATIONS

- 3.01 Sponsor agrees to pay to the University a fixed-price sum of \$11,500, in U.S. dollars, per class offered each year (Phase I). Not later than April 15th of each year, the Sponsor shall provide to the University a confirmed count of enrollment and number of classes to be offered. The fixed price payment will be based on this enrollment count, and will not be reduced in the event that actual enrollment is decreased at class time.
- 3.02 Sponsor shall pay said fixed-price, sum in one up-front payment each year. Said payment shall be submitted not later than April 15th and shall be transmitted with the enrollment/class count required in section 3.01 herein. No services will be provided unless these payments have been received in advance. No involcing or financial reporting will be required.
- 3.03 In addition to funding amounts committed to in section 3.02, the Sponsor shall pay the complete travel expenses of OSU faculty members traveling to Chihuahua. Additionally, housing will be provided in a group home setting or an apartment. A cook will be provided to prepare meals for the OSU faculty members. If the OSU faculty member wishes to bring their family to Chihuahua during the one-month stay, the accompanying family members will also receive free room and board provided that they occupy a single room with two double beds.
- 3.04 Doctoral students may make short term visits to the University to complete doctoral activities (Phase II). For each student visiting the University, Sponsor agrees to pay University a fixed-price sum of \$500, in U.S. dollars, per student. Not less than 30 days prior to said visit, Sponsor will provide to University a confirmed count of students. Sponsor will transmit payment not less than 30 days prior to student visit. Student will not travel to University unless payment has been made in advance. No invoicing or financial reporting will be required.
- 3.05 In addition to funding amounts committed to in section 3.04, the Sponsor shall pay the complete travel expenses of any doctoral students visiting the University, including travel, lodging, per diem, visa, airport transfers, and all other associated costs.)
- 3.04 Expenditure of said funds will be unrestricted by budget category, and may be spent on such costs as food/meals, apartment costs, and any costs associated with the training program.

4.0 PUBLICITY

4.01 Sponsor will not use the name of University, nor of any member of University's Project staff, in any publicity, advertising, or news release without the prior written approval of

an authorized representative of University. University will not use the name of Sponsor, nor any employee of Sponsor, in any publicity without the prior written approval of Sponsor. The parties agree that the required approvals set forth herein will not be unreasonably withheld.

5.0 TERM AND TERMINATION

- 5.01 This Agreement shall become effective upon the date first above written and shall continue in effect for the full duration of the Agreement Period unless sooner terminated in accordance with the provisions of this Article. The parties hereto may, however, extend the term of this Agreement for additional periods as desired under mutually agreeable terms and conditions which the parties reduce to writing and sign. Either party may terminate this Agreement upon ninety (90) days written notice to the other.
- 5.02 In the event that either party shall commit any breach of or default in any of the terms or conditions of this Agreement, and also shall fail to remedy such default or breach within ninety (90) days after receipt of written notice thereof from the other party hereto, the party giving notice may, at its option and in addition to any other remedies which it may have at law or in equity, terminate this Agreement by sending notice of termination in writing to the other party to such effect, and such termination shall be effective as of the date of the receipt of such notice.
- 5.03 Termination of this Agreement by either party for any reason shall not affect the rights and obligations of the parties accrued prior to the effective date of termination of this Agreement. No termination of this Agreement, however effectuated, shall affect the parties' rights and duties or release the parties hereto from their obligations under the other Sections of this Agreement.

6.0 INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

6.01 In the performance of all services hereunder:

- (a) In making and performing this Agreement, University and Sponsor act and shall act at all times as independent contractors and nothing contained in this Agreement shall be construed or implied to create an agency, partnership, joint venture, or employer and employee relationship between University and Sponsor.
- (b) Neither party is authorized or empowered to act as agent for the other for any purpose and shall not on behalf of the other enter into any contract, warranty, or representation as to any matter. Neither shall be bound by the acts or conduct of the other.

7.0 LIABILITY AND RISK

7.01 University represents that it has statutorily prescribed liability insurance coverage for the negligent acts of its officers, employees, and agents while acting within the scope of their

employment by University, and University has no liability insurance policy as such that can extend protection to any other person, including Sponsor.

- 7.02 Subject to the provisions of the Oklahoma Governmental Tort Claims Act, including its limits or liability and exclusions therefrom, University assumes any and all risks of personal injury and property damage attributable to the negligent acts or omission of the University, its officers, employees and agents thereof.
- 7.03 Sponsor hereby assumes any and all risks of personal injury and property damage attributable to the negligent acts or omissions of Sponsor, its officers, employees, and agents thereof.
- 7.04 Sponsor agrees to indemnify and hold harmless University and its governing Board, officers, agents, and employees from any liability, loss, or damage they may suffer as the result of claims, demands, costs, or judgments against them arising out of the activities to be carried out pursuant to this Agreement.

8.00 GOVERNING LAW

8.01 This Agreement shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Oklahoma. The forum for any proceeding or suit in law or equity arising from or incident to this Agreement shall be located in the State of Oklahoma.

9.00 ASSIGNMENT

9.01 This Agreement shall not be assigned by either party without the prior written consent of the parties hereto.

10.00 GOVERNMENT RIGHTS

10.01 The parties acknowledge that pursuant to 37 CFR §401 the United States government may have some rights in the inventions and discoveries under this Agreement, which rights, if applicable, would include a non-exclusive, nontransferable paid up license to practice or have practiced for or on behalf of the United States the subject invention(s) throughout the world.

11.00 AGREEMENT MODIFICATION

11.01 Any agreement to change the terms of this Agreement in any way shall be valid only if the change is made in writing and approved by mutual agreement of authorized representatives of the parties hereto.

EXHIBIT "A" STATEMENT OF WORK

University of Chihuahua Department of Zootecnia and Oklahoma State University Division of Agriculture Specifications for Programa de Doctorado Conjunto

This statement of work covers the teaching of courses at UACH by faculty members of the Division of Agricultural Sciences and Natural Resources at Oklahoma State University.

The general objective of this agreement is for the University faculty to teach a course in the same manner that they would teach a doctoral program course in the the University graduate program, except to conduct that activity in a compressed time frame of four weeks on the UACH Campus. The credits for the campus will be granted by the University of Chihuahua. Students will not be formally enrolled at Oklahoma State University. The International Programs Office of the Division of Agriculture will provide a letter of course completion for each student at the end of the program. This letter will verify their successful completion of a course taught by the University faculty in this program, that the faculty member has followed a curriculum equal to that of a University doctoral program course, and will serve as a formal way to indicate the academic diversity that this has created in their UACH doctoral program.

It is mutually agreed that all activities in this program would be conducted in English, the University is not able to provide instruction in Spanish. No TOEFL score is required for the UACH students, although they assume the responsibility of developing their English language ability to a level that would allow them to successfully complete the courses. If a University faculty member feels that they need to administer a written or oral examination in Spanish in order to verify the actual knowledge level of a student, UACH will provide translation services in order to make this type of assessment possible.

It is understood that there might be up to 30 doctoral programs involved and that those students may travel to the University for short-term stay to complete doctoral work. The preferred format for such a doctoral dissertation is three journal articles, prepared in a manner that they can be submitted to peer reviewed journals. UACH will provide editorial support as necessary to ensure that an adequate level of English language is attained in the writing of the dissertation articles to allow for publishable work.

Outside of doctoral students visiting their committee members, the University will accept a limited number of visiting scholars for short term stays at no charge (assuming that travel, lodging, per diem, visas, airport transfers and all other costs costs are paid by the scholar or UACH).

Oklahoma State University and the University of Chihuahua are both considering this activity as a stepping stone to future collaboration. It is our desire that this collaboration will reach a level of quality that allows our scientists to jointly publish their results in a refereed journal.

EXHIBIT "A" STATEMENT OF WORK

University of Chihuahua Department of Zootecnia and Oklahoma State University Division of Agriculture Specifications for Programa de Doctorado Conjunto

This statement of work covers the teaching of courses at UACH by faculty members of the Division of Agricultural Sciences and Natural Resources at Oklahoma State University.

The general objective of this agreement is for the University faculty to teach a course in the same manner that they would teach a doctoral program course in the the University graduate program, except to conduct that activity in a compressed time frame of four weeks on the UACH Campus. The credits for the campus will be granted by the University of Chihuahua. Students will not be formally enrolled at Oklahoma State University. The International Programs Office of the Division of Agriculture will provide a letter of course completion for each student at the end of the program. This letter will verify their successful completion of a course taught by the University faculty in this program, that the faculty member has followed a curriculum equal to that of a University doctoral program course, and will serve as a formal way to indicate the academic diversity that this has created in their UACH doctoral program.

It is mutually agreed that all activities in this program would be conducted in English, the University is not able to provide instruction in Spanish. No TOEFL score is required for the UACH students, although they assume the responsibility of developing their English language ability to a level that would allow them to successfully complete the courses. If a University faculty member feels that they need to administer a written or oral examination in Spanish in order to verify the actual knowledge level of a student, UACH will provide translation services in order to make this type of assessment possible.

It is understood that there might be up to 30 doctoral programs involved and that those students may travel to the University for short-term stay to complete doctoral work. The preferred format for such a doctoral dissertation is three journal articles, prepared in a manner that they can be submitted to peer reviewed journals. UACH will provide editorial support as necessary to ensure that an adequate level of English language is attained in the writing of the dissertation articles to allow for publishable work.

Outside of doctoral students visiting their committee members, the University will accept a limited number of visiting scholars for short term stays at no charge (assuming that travel, lodging, per diem, visas, airport transfers and all other costs costs are paid by the scholar or UACH).

Oklahoma State University and the University of Chihuahua are both considering this activity as a stepping stone to future collaboration. It is our desire that this collaboration will reach a level of quality that allows our scientists to jointly publish their results in a refereed journal.
