Dear Josefina,

It is very unfortunate that the applications from your two students, Javier Holguín- Seañez and María Madrigal-Muñoz, have come to the University of Manitoba under such confusing circumstances. We have been just as distressed as you in trying to understand this situation. Perhaps we can now work together to resolve this.

The applications for Javier and Maria arrived in our office in late August without any cover letter or any indication as to which student exchange agreement these students were applying through. In fact, we had no indication of the students' home university other than the seal stamped on their transcript copies. The applications arrived at an extremely busy time of year and little time could be spent on follow-up.

We have dozens of Mexican students coming to the Univ of Manitoba each year on any number of different exchange agreements. We also participate in several consortium exchanges, such as CONAHEC, which tends to make it even more confusing. It was not until yesterday that anyone mentioned your North American Mobility linkage with our Faculty of Agriculture. Since neither of the students had listed any Agriculture courses in their applications, we had no association between the students and this agreement prior to yesterday.

I am not sure, at this point from where you have received any notice of rejection for the students. Our office has not sent anything of this sort as we were waiting to try and find information on which partnership agreement these students belonged. We did approach the CONAHEC office to see if these students were being sent through the CONAHEC program. As it is now clear that they are not coming through CONAHEC, any response from CONAHEC (if they had issued a rejection) does not apply to this situation.

The students' applications were both sent over to our UM Faculty of Agriculture yesterday. They will be processed according to the terms of the North American Mobility agreement signed with this faculty.

I hope we can generate a positive solution for these students in the very near future. Please let me if there is any additional information that we need to consider or any further way that we can assist these students.

Dr. James Dean, A/Executive Director for International Relations at the Univ of Manitoba, is attending the CONAHEC meetings in Puerto Rico this week. If Dr. Nuñez cares to meet with him during the conference, I am certain that Dr. Dean would welcome this opportunity.
